State Leaders Forum

State Leaders forum will be held November 16–18 at the conference grounds at Asilomar. This year's conference theme is "Open Spaces: Endless Opportunities". The conference provides an opportunity for leaders to engage in hands-on learning, while further developing leadership and project skills. The cost for the conference is \$215.00 if paid by September 1, \$265 if after Sept.1. The Marin County 4-H Council encourages new leaders to attend the conference by providing financial support for first time attendees. California State Fair Farm

If you want to know what it's like to live and work on a real farm, you'll love the fair's Farm Camp. Kids between 6-12 years of age can enjoy hands-on activities like farm-inspired crafts, stories around the campfire and BBQ supper. Day Camp takes place from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on August 24th and 31st. The cost is \$20.00 per child and does not include admission to the fair or parking. For the truly adventurous, sleepover Camp at the Farm ex-



tends the fun experience with an overnight stay in tents. Sleepover camp includes a continental breakfast, and adults or guardians are encouraged to attend and assist with mealtimes at both events. Sleepover camp costs an additional \$10 (\$30.00 total) and does not include admission to the fair or parking. Deadline for sign-up is August 3, 2007. Club Wrap-up for the Year

As the 4-H year comes to an end, each club has a responsibility to complete their club reports. Each club must submit:

- ~ an Annual Financial Report, with a copy of the July 2007 bank statement
- ~ an inventory report, including all inventory over \$1,500.00
- \sim the Marin County Treasury Statement which must be audited by each club before submitting to the 4-H office
- ~ 4-H outreach documentation
- ~ award nominations for Meritorious, Friend of 4-H, and Leader Recognition
- ***All clubs must submit this information by August 1, 2007. Information must be received at the 4-H office before enrolling for the new 4-H year
- *** Youth Officer Books may be submitted along with the club's record book entries and star applications by September 14, 2007.

Record Book Judging

Marin County 4-H Record Book Judging will take place on September 19, at 6:00 p.m. at the 4-H office in Novato. The 4-H council will provide a light meal prior to judging. Each club must provide one judge for every three books entered. Adult volunteers and teen leaders are encouraged to participate in this event. Star recipients are required to help in judging primary record books. 4-H members have until mid-September to complete their record books. Members may include their summer 4-H events and awards received. Check with your community club leader for club deadlines.
