We are excited to add a *countywide goat project* this year. The leaders are Lisa Hartman from the Tri-Valley club and Robin Torassa from Nicasio.

Our first meeting will be at the Harvest Fair at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds in Santa Rosa. We will be attending their pygmy goat show on October 2 at 9:00 am. We are hoping to meet some breeders and learn how to show goats.

This year the Marin County Fair will have a pygmy goat show and so our project will focus on learning about how to care for goats and how to prepare them for the show.

Our plan is to have six meetings this year. Most of them will be field trips to visit people who can teach us about goats, since neither of the leaders has ever had pygmy goats. We will all be learning together!

National 4-H Week is Oct. 4-8

National 4-H Week is a time to celebrate the 4-H program and share with others everything we have to offer. We aren't just about animals!

***4-H is the nation's largest youth organization**, with 6 million participants.

***4-H is a part of Cooperative Extension.** 4-H takes research-based information from the nation's land grant universities to youth in urban, small town and rural communities.

***4-H follows the philosophy of learning by doing.** Youth develop life skills through hands-on projects that range from citizenship to expressive arts, communication to foods and nutrition, and leadership to science and technology.

***4-H is for youth in grades 1 through 12.** Youth can make new friends, visit new places, go on trips, attend workshops and conferences, host meetings and help their communities.

***4-H partners with the Army Youth Development Project (AYDP).** Together they serve children with parents in the military through Operation Military Kids (OMK).

Here are some ways to tell others about 4-H:

- *Wear your 4-H shirt to events.
- *Put up display boards and posters about 4-H around the community.
- *Decorate your driveway. Make works of art with sidewalk chalk.
- *Visit a classroom at your school or Sunday school class and 'advertise' 4-H!
- *Paint the windows in an area business (don't forget to ask first)
- *Take goodies to a 4-H supporter or trophy sponsor
- *Create a button that says "Ask me about 4-H"
- *Be a spokesperson - tell your family and friends about 4-H.
- *Participate! Celebrate! Have Fun!
