
Presentation Day

Mill Valley Superintendent of Schools Honors Emily Press

Emily Press, Mill Valley 4-H member was presented with a special award from the Superintendent of her school district. At a public meeting, he read the following:

"This is Emily Press. She is a fifth grader at park school. She read a post on my Facebook about 120 miniature horses seized from a hoarder situation in Southern Oregon that were slated for slaughter. She researched it and found it to be a true and sad situation. The horses were in bad shape, emaciated, injured, and not socialized. With the organization of her amazing teacher Danny Marsh and the park school principle Andrew Withers, she rallied her classmates to save these miniature horses. She made posters, had bake sales, and the park school world repair club also donated money. They raised enough money to send two rigs up the 15 to bring back as many ponies as they could. The larger rig brought 12, and the smaller rig held 6. On the way back down I5 at night in the middle of nowhere, the larger rig ran into mechanical difficulty. They stopped in a small town and woke up the only mechanic. He got them back on the road, and all 18 ponies made it safely to Lost Hearts and Soul Rescue association in Sonoma, where they were rehabilitated. Most of them have been adopted out to loving homes. A couple are still having foot work done, and should be adopted out soon. Through Emily's efforts 18 lives were saved. Emily has a light inside her that shines so bright. She can make anything happen. For this we honor her tonight."
