4-H County Ambassadors serve in the highest 4-H leadership role in Marin County 4-H. A core component of the 4-H County Ambassador program is youth working collaboratively to develop, implement, and evaluate a Plan-of-Action to strengthen the 4-H program. Additionally, 4-H County Ambassadors are liaisons between the county 4-H office, 4-H members and volunteers, and the public. Candidates must be between 14-18 years old, completed at least 1 year in 4-H, and have demonstrated leadership and citizenship skills.

Lead 4-H activities at the Sonoma-Marin Fair, June 19-23, 1-3pm daily

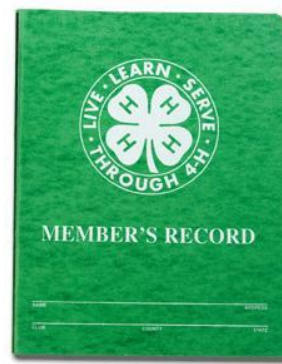

4-H Diamond Clover Award

The California Diamond Clover is the highest achievement for which a 4-H youth member and young adult volunteers are recognized. All youth members and young adult volunteer who achieve the requirements are eligible to receive this award.
