Jackpot Shows and 4-H

A jackpot show is defined as one in which entry fees are charged and cash prizes or premiums are awarded from the accumulated entry fees or other matching funds. The ownership and project participation entry requirements of jackpot shows and the handling of premium funds are not consistent with the State 4-H policies and practices. Youth may participate as individuals with their own insurance. The University liability program will not be extended to include jackpot shows. In addition 4-H clubs or groups may not sponsor, co-sponsor or host in any way jackpot shows.

State Leaders Forum

State Leaders forum will be held November 16–18 at the conference grounds at Asilomar. This year's conference theme is "Open Spaces: Endless Opportunities". The conference provides an opportunity for leaders to engage in hands-on learning, while further developing leadership and project skills.

The cost for the conference is \$215.00 if paid by August 1, 2007. The Marin County 4-H Council encourages new leaders to attend the conference by providing scholarships for those first time attendees. Contact the 4-H office for details and additional information at 499-4207.

California State Fair Volunteer

Fair Tips

Showmanship~

Your show uniform should consist of: ~4-H/FFA/Independent— a solid white

- collared dress shirt, long or short sleeve, button or snap front. Shirt must be tucked into pants. NO teeshirts or sleeveless shirts/tops.
- ~4-H/Independent— white jeans or pants. NO hip-huggers or low-rise jeans/pants.
- \sim 4-H- Official tie or scarf and 4-H hat.
- ~ FFA- Official tie or scarf and FFA jacket.
- Brush up on your knowledge of your animal
- Be prepared to answer questions from the judges
- Practice your showmanship skills before going to the fair.
- Make sure your animal is healthy and well groomed
- Be prepared!!!

Record Books

Your record book is a record of your accomplishments during the previous 4-H year. There are several reasons why youth should complete a record book each year:

- 1. Record keeping is one of the important life skills to be gained from your 4-H experience.
- 2. When completing your records, you can review all you have accomplished throughout the past year.
- 3. To earn recognition at club and county level with Star Rank Awards.
- 4. A complete Record Book can also serve as a portfolio for a particular job, school/college and scholarship applications.
- 5. Senior record books can go on to compete at the State level to receive cash awards for outstanding record books.

Finishing up for the Year

As the 4-H year comes to an end, each club has a responsibility to complete their club reports. Each club must submit:

- ~ an Annual Treasury Report, with a copy of the July 2007 bank statement
- ~ an inventory report, including all inventory over \$1500.00
- \sim the Marin County Treasury Statement, which must be audited by each club before submitting to the 4-H office
- ~ 4-H outreach documentation
- ~ award nominations for Meritorious, Friend of 4-H, and Leader Recognition ****All clubs should submit this information by August 1, 2007. Information must be received at the 4-H office before enrolling for the new 4-H year.*** Youth Officer Books may be submitted along with the club's record book entries by September 14th, 2007.

Record Book Judging

Due to the change in State 4-H Record Book competition, Marin County 4-H Council has decided to move the Marin County 4-H Record Book judging to September 19th. Members will have until mid-September to complete their record books. Members will also have the opportunity to include their summer 4-H events and awards received. Check with your community club leader for club deadlines.
