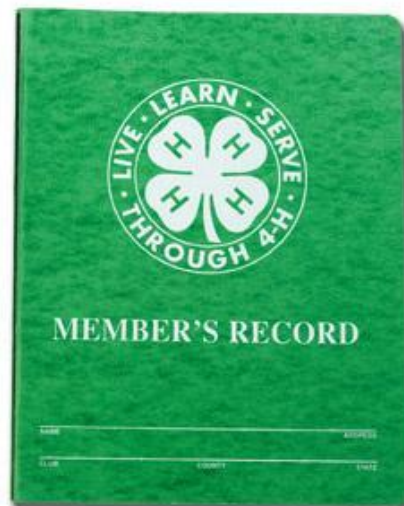
Record Books (due August 8)

Books are due for county judging by **August 8 by 4:00pm**. Judging will take place on Saturday, August 18. Clubs are required to send one evaluator for every three record books submitted.

There is a **Newcastle Disease (vND)** outbreak in Southern California starting to spread to small flocks of backyard birds (over 30+BYs). Be aware of the situation and take precautions. In the Spring edition of [Poultry Ponderings](#) from UC Davis Vet Med, you can find more information regarding Newcastle disease and how to take any necessary precautions.



In California, effective January 1, 2018, over-the-counter injectable and medically-important **antimicrobials** must be administered with a prescription or veterinary feed directive (VDF) ordered by a California-licensed veterinarian under a valid veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR). Note that these changes are separate from the federal regulations regarding antimicrobials in feed and water that became effective on January 1, 2017. [Read more.](#)
