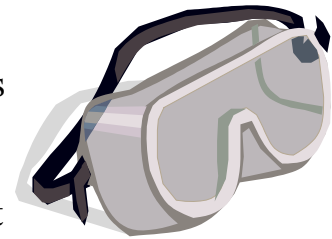
## State Leadership Conference

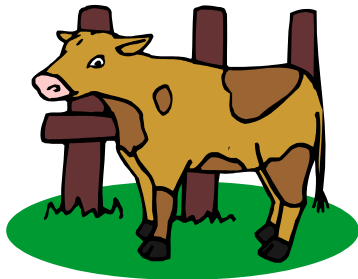
## COUNTY AND CLUB NEWS
