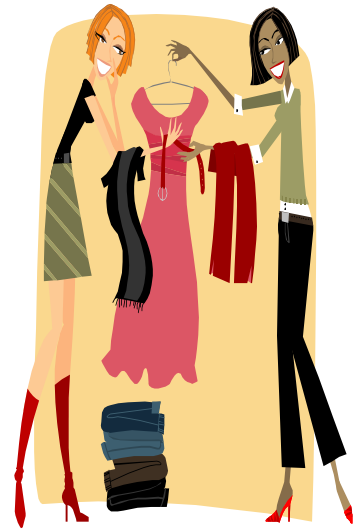

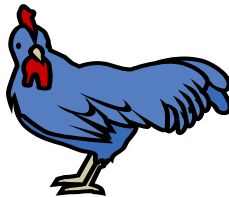


### **Emerson Hogue Dairy Replacement Heifer Scholarship**
